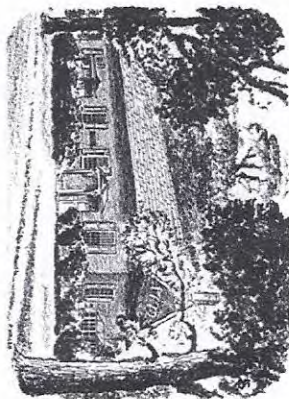

George Fox, the founder of The Society of Friends had visited Burlington County in 1672 while on a religious pilgrimage from England. His followers, also known as Quakers, arrived in Burlington County in 1677 and 1678 at the city of Burlington on the ships Kent, and Shield. By 1780 they were well established in many communities in Burlington County.

Members of the Society of Friends were called "Quakers" as a term of derision. Eventually the term was embraced by the sect in America.
